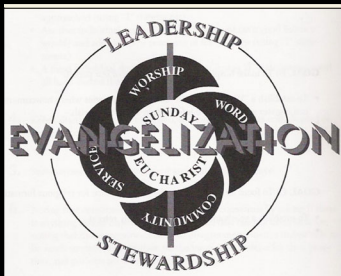

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

Each Sunday we listen to three readings from Scripture. Often it's the Gospel passage that is preached. During Ordinary Time the first reading, generally from the Hebrew writings (the Old Testament), and the Gospel share a common theme. The second reading is a continuous reading through the "Pastoral Letters".

For the past several weeks the second reading has been from the First Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians. The reading will conclude next week.

The First Letter to the Corinthians is the second longest of the letters of St. Paul. We know that because his letters are ordered from longest to shortest – Romans to Philemon - in the New Testament. Interesting, should you ever play Jeopardy!

The Christian community at Corinth was established during Paul's second missionary journey sometime around the year 50. The First Letter to the Corinthians was written around the year 56. That makes it the oldest of the writings of the New Testament. The letter was written from Ephesus during Paul's third missionary journey. Its writing predates any Gospel. Again, interesting and important if you play Jeopardy!

This letter is an insight to St. Paul and the early church. It praises what is going well and it directs faults, it remembers the faith and ritualistic actions that has been passed down to them. In the letter we find the "issues" of the early church are not very different from today: division, immoral sex, the discovery and use of spiritual gifts, the role of women, and conversion to Jesus himself. It's really a perfect epistle. But, which one isn't? They are all necessary to understand our faith and conversion to Jesus' message.

I've found in this letter an appeal to the intellect, heart, and direct moral actions. That is, it is a perfect instruction to full conversion. By themselves - reason, affect, or moral choice - cannot be the cause of faith. Together they make it believable, that is, credible. Together faith can be lived and strengthened.

Take time to re-read First Corinthians. It will correct the deficiencies of your faith, encourage the growth of grace and love in our faith community and your family, and remind you of what you have learned by way of inheritance. Why do we do it this way? Why do we believe this? Because our ancestors found it to be the truth of Jesus and his disciples. After all, our faith is apostolic!
