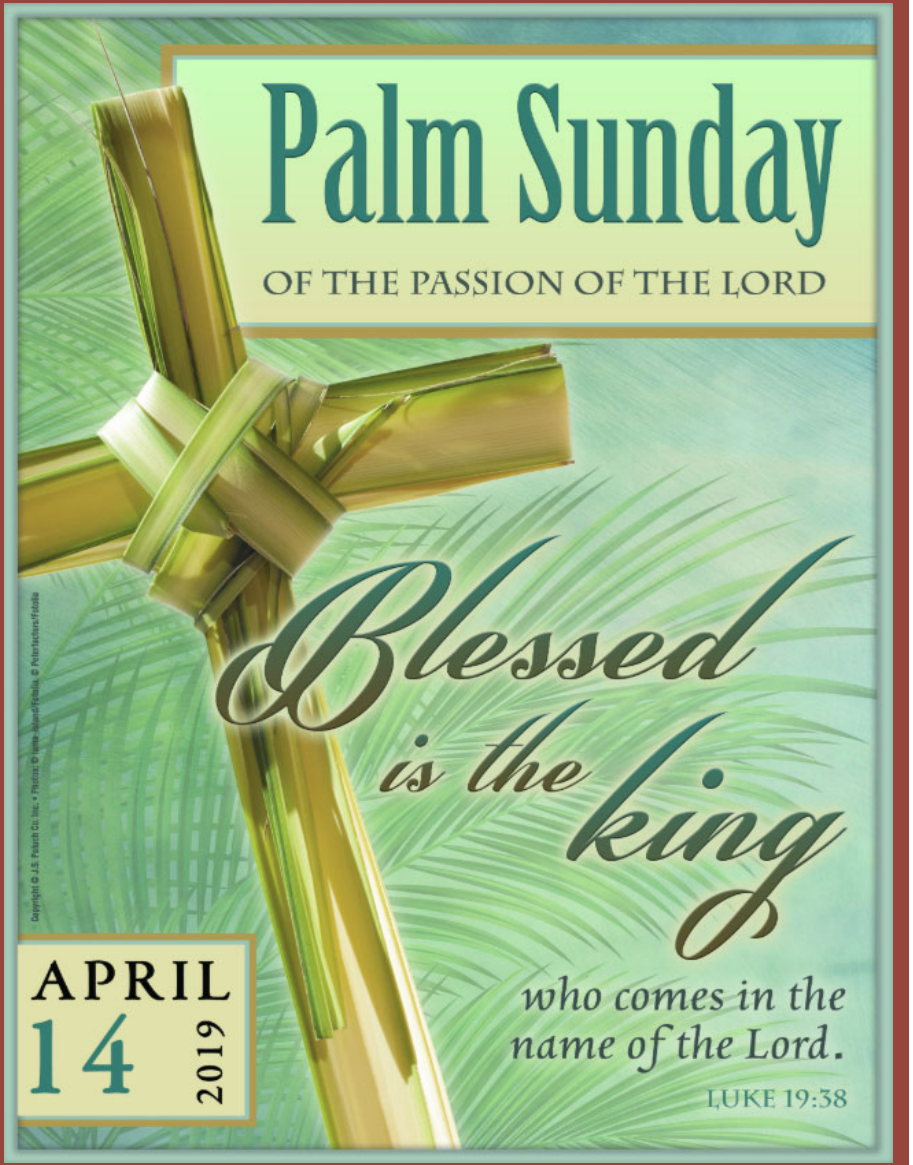

PALM SUNDAY, THE PASSION OF THE LORD

This is the great work, the *Opus Dei*, the grand opera of the Lord. Today's reading of the Passion of Jesus is the heart of our faith. Today begins Holy Week, the Great Week of our Faith.

The Passion is the oldest narrative our ancestors have left us. BEFORE they sang *Away In A Manger*, BEFORE they retold the Sermon on the Mount, BEFORE any miracle was the Good News of Jesus – the events of Jesus' death and his resurrection were remembered and celebrated.

The Passion of Jesus is the manual of our faith formation. The Passion is Jesus under a magnifying glass. It is the essence of the Good News of Jesus. There is no Gospel without the Passion. Because Gospel means Good News, this is the Gospel.

The story moves pretty fast. Re-read it during the week, come to the Solemn Ceremony of Good Friday and hear it again. Move with the reading. Welcome Jesus into Jerusalem. Walk with him along the way. Offer him help. Which of the characters are you, presume you are NOT Jesus! Be at his side. Receive his body. Remain in communion with him. Wait and see what happens next! WOW!


Lent's purpose is to change the lives of those who follow Jesus. In this narrative, notice whose lives are changed and whose lives are not changed. Notice who makes an act of faith and who fails to recognize the very person of the Good News.

From the Passion, what are you receiving?

From the Passion, what do you have to give?

From the Passion, what do you risk by being a disciple of Jesus?

How will you keep this week HOLY? Resist spiritual sloth; pray as a community.

Nifty questions. 

Tomorrow evening, Monday of Holy Week, April 15 – in any year an ominous day – at Christ Cathedral Arboretum 13280 Chapman Avenue, Garden Grove – at 5:30PM Bishop Vann and many priests will celebrate the Chrism Mass, it's the Mass wherein the bishop blesses the Holy Oils to be used during the coming year. It's spectacular, you are invited and welcome to attend.

Easter is one celebration in three distinct ceremonies –

* Holy Thursday Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper (Thursday at 7:00PM),

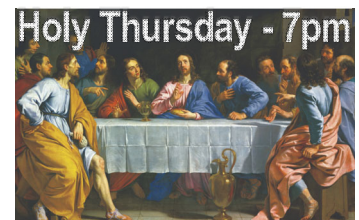
* Good Friday -The Passion of the Lord (Solemn Service at 1:00PM),

* and the Great Easter Vigil

(7:00PM - first gather outside around the New Fire
~ let the Easter Candle lead us into the church)

* or Easter Sunday itself

The Passion of Our Lord

We begin the final week of Lent with familiar readings. This year, we hear the Passion from the Gospel of Luke. These readings for Palm Sunday and the Passion used to be read on successive Sundays. Now they are combined into a single feast, so that we may see the whole sweep of the glory and the suffering played out. Jesus accepts the adulation of the crowd, the foreshadowing of his glory in the Resurrection. He bids farewell to his disciples in his last Passover, and forgives his tormentors as he dies on the cross. Later this week, we enter the Holy Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday, when the whole story of our redemption will play out once again.

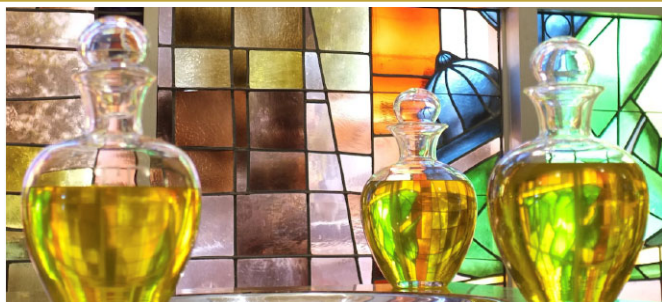

CHRISM MASS - MON., APRIL 15TH



The annual *Chrism Mass* for the **Blessing of the Holy Oils** and **Renewal of Priestly Commitment** will be celebrated at Christ Cathedral on Monday of Holy Week, **April 15th at 5:30pm**. Bishop Kevin Vann will be presiding.

The **Oil of the Sick** and the **Oil of the Catechumens** will be blessed and the **Oil of Sacred Chrism** will be consecrated for use in each of the parishes at this annual diocesan celebration.

Did you know this about the Chrism Mass?

The Chrism Mass is celebrated in every cathedral in the world in preparation for the Easter Triduum. Only a bishop can consecrate chrim, pure olive oil infused with rich fragrance, so this liturgy is a sign of the unity of the local Church and the bishop's ministry to all who will be baptized and confirmed in our parishes in the coming year. Chrism is also used in the ordination of priests and bishops and the consecration of new altars. Two other sacramental oils, the unscented olive oil for catechumens and for the sick, will be blessed in the same liturgy and transported carefully to every parish by the beginning of the Triduum.

Remember when Noah's dove returned with the sign of the world's rebirth? The dove carried an olive branch, a pledge that God was breathing the world to life again. Yet olives require human nurture. Olives are inedible unless they are cured by human labor. Olive trees grow on sunny slopes, away from the shade of city walls, so they can only be properly tended, cured, and laboriously pressed in peace time. **The Chrism Mass with its olive oils expresses God's deepest desires for us, and our resolve to place our lives in service to God's saving, healing, loving plan.**

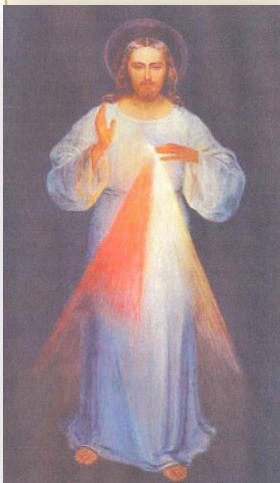

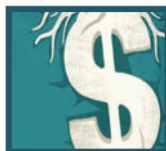

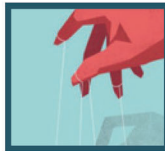
