A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M

Some events are hard to understand or believe because they are mysteries of faith. Easter. The Trinity.

Some events are just difficult to understand and believe. Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin landing and walking on the moon. That July 1969 date is a happy one. Not all are joyful. Assassinations, December 7, 1941, and September 11, 2001 are regrettable events. Lately, April 15, 2019, the burning of Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris, I just can't get it out of my mind. When I saw Notre Dame's spire fall I thought "that's the end of it." What devastation and I had to see it. Tuesday morning came, the news report and pictures showing not all was lost brought good news to the ears and tears of joy in the eyes. **WOW!**

WOW – that's the experience of the Great Cathedral – the response to beauty is **WOW!** The ceiling is so high, raising to God it reaches into forever – that's why a high ceiling is called a "cathedral ceiling!" **WOW** – the sound from the organ and choir, majestic, ethereal, and sacred. **WOW** – Mass celebrated at the main altar. **WOW** – from windows, to façade, to flying buttresses, bells, organ, to vaulted ceiling, to great doors, to goofy gargoyles. **WOW!**

Notre Dame, Our Lady's Cathedral, does what beauty does – it opens the soul – to God. **WOW!** **Is our response to the presence of God!** Before he became a Bishop, Robert Barron wrote a wonderful little book: *Heaven in Stone and Glass*; Crossroad Publishing, 2001. The title is the point; the stone and glass of Notre Dame and other great worship spaces reveal heaven to the docile soul. Sit in our church during the day and watch the play of sunlight. **WOW!** You will find God in our 1965 mid-century modern church. It is not Notre Dame, but it works. Visit Our Lady of Guadalupe in La Habra or St. Joseph Parish in Santa Ana, only visit - your church is here (!) – these are examples of churches with beautiful windows in our diocese. Experience beauty. St. Catherine Academy in Anaheim is also beautiful, there I have vested.

Beauty is not a matter of taste. You know beauty by its sight, sound, the design of a well written verse, and the ballet dance. Ah, the depth of beauty's genius, the experience that it leaves within you. Beauty proclaims its presence to you. Beauty is powerful!

The fire reports have left me wondering if Notre Dame Cathedral isn't considered as "just another museum." Let's be clear, it is an active cathedral! It is the place where people go to worship; it's a living Catholic community. The life of that parish has been disrupted, people are displaced! It isn't "just another tourist attraction" welcoming, by some reports, thirteen million people annually, a bit more than thirty-five thousand people through its doors every day. Go to Paris and check Notre Dame Cathedral off your bucket list. Or visit it as a house where God dwells; where the divine and human meet. Heaven in stone and glass!

I wonder if faith has become a museum piece remaining from Great Ages of the long past. Has lively **faith** in God's good works lost its **WOW** while **buildings** continue to be visited? Is Rome an elaborate mausoleum, featuring left overs of another day? The reports and their results are hard to understand, at least they are difficult for me to read.

I'm glad we are together! Celebrate the presence of Christ living among us in our community, Scripture, and Sacraments this Easter season and every day.
