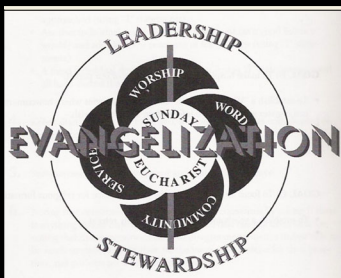

It was some Christmas past when my Mom and two lady friends attended a Christmas Eve Mass together. They arrived early, that's when they began talking: "Look, she's remarried - he's her new husband." "Wow, did he lose weight - what's happened?" "Cancer..." There was more. Then my Mom recalled she asked the other two: "Look, those pews are reserved, I wonder for whom." That prompted the fellow in front of the three of them to turn around and respond: "Ladies, those pews are reserved for people who don't gossip!"

Knowing they owed the man an apology, they said they were sorry. He was right, it wasn't the right place or time.

The wonderful Old Testament book of Ecclesiastes teaches, "There is an appointed time for everything, and a time for every affair under the heavens." A group called The Byrds put those biblical lines to music under the title *Turn, Turn, Turn*.

There is a time for everything – or most everything. Somethings should have no time – jumping from the Golden Gate Bridge or sneezing so loudly that it draws attention to your rudeness. Along with a proper time there is a proper place for actions. Much of human behavior is reasoned by common sense. The rest is found in a handbook or the code of civil or canon law. Usually, the thicker the handbook or penal code, the *thicker* (read: *dumber*) the society. Most laws are for people who don't take time to think. A lot of wrong actions are attributable to ignorance (not thinking) not malice (vicious behavior).

Some of us have been studying vice and virtue during Lent: turn from the naughty and practice the nice! Sloth is the vice; zealotness or diligence is the virtue. Sloth, like apathy, simply allows life to go on with a kind of comfortable indifference to surroundings and neglect of the presence of God or the presence and needs of other people around us. Sloth treats other people as if they are invisible. Sloth is one of the great capital sins because it lacks care, love, or service for God and other people. It is a resistance to the transforming demands of God's love.

Sloth is, for example, not being aware that we are in a church. The presence of God and people is neither noticed nor revered. That's why the fellow was right in pointing out my Mom's wrong and she was right in her apology. He came to pray, not to listen to other people catch up with one another about one another; it was neither the time nor the place to be gabby.

In church our attention should go ahead of us, literally ahead, to Christ who is on the cross and in the tabernacle in the sanctuary of the church. Behavior in the presence of Jesus should be marked by reverence and awe. Sometime in the recent past church customs got relaxed; indifference to surroundings and neglect for reverence became normal behavior. Many people come into a church unaware of God. With what consequence? Congregations lacked sophistication, they became vulgar. Sloth lacks energy and gravitas.

The remedy for sloth is zeal or diligence, (root is diligere which means "to love"). Once you have a transforming experience of God you are sent out to "Glorify the Lord by the way you live your life." Zeal is the attitude of missionary disciples. It's living your life for the sake of the Kingdom of God. Consider the image of Mary who, although pregnant, "ran in haste" to the house of her kinswoman Elizabeth.

When we fail to give the same sacred attention, awe, or reverence we would have at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier we fall into sloth's trap. When attitude at worship is ho hum, or as Bishop Barron calls it "beige", we have fallen into sloth's trap.

When attention is given to God there is momentum and zeal for the Kingdom. When other people are no longer invisible to us, when we are no longer indifferent to them, we have been transformed and can change the life of another, for God's sake. We change from a common, ordinary, vulgar life to missionary disciples headed for the Kingdom of God.

When we realize that all relationships need nourishment and when we invest time and effort not narcissistically but toward God and other people, love will change us. That zeal will require of us a restructuring of our priorities and plans. Sacrifice is demanded of us. It's called stewardship! The slothful will resist. The zealous will transform communities. Virtuous living is transforming.

Go and glorify the Lord by the way you live your life!

EASTER is fast approaching. Easter is one celebration in three ceremonies – Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Great Easter Vigil or Easter Sunday. Please keep the three feasts – the Easter Triduum.
