




#### THE PARISH AS ONE BODY

#### A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M

The lectionary readings for the Easter Season, both weekday and Sunday, are brilliant! If you cannot attend daily Mass, read and meditation on them, <a href="www.usceb.org">www.usceb.org</a> is a free site, it's the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops site. It features an audio voice which reads to you.

On seasonal weekdays the Acts of the Apostles is featured. On Sundays, the readings are from the Act of the Apostles and Revelation. Acts, written by St. Luke, offers the history of the first apostles. It's a record of their doings, their acts. As such, it is a wonderful experience of the faith, culture, identity, and mission of the Early Church.

First the Apostles experienced and proclaimed in words and powerful deeds, the death and resurrection of Jesus; "Mystery of Faith." They were formed by what they witnessed as Good News. Let's be clear - Christianity is not primarily an agent of social service, neither is it a philosophy, nor is it hero worship. It

is about a relationship with Almighty God as He is revealed and experienced in Jesus Christ. In Jesus, God lets us in on the secret of who He is and what He is all about. That experience becomes friendship. Friendship with Jesus urges us to form community with Christians. It's why we join a church community and encourage others to do the same. It's called evangelization. Psst: It's the mission of everything the Church is about; it's the goal of Catholic education.

The culture of the Apostles and their community was "unity and peace" a gift from the Holy Spirit which kept the apostolic community together. The common life of the Apostles is referenced twice: Acts 2:42-47 and again 4:32-37. Note the root of their life: the breaking of the bread. Meditate on those prayers of the Mass which petition "unity and peace." Unity is pretty much a stumbling block today. How much unity can the Church or civil society accept and tolerate?

In priesT-school (pronounce the "T" clearly) I recall a particular "spiritual theology" class for which I didn't care for. In the same class in which we were asked to reflect on the most meaningful of all Christmas lyrics (I chose Fa, La, La, La, La, La...) we were asked to reflect on a "new hymn" of unity. Many of you will recall those horrendous songs of the early liturgical reform in the 1960s. Remember how *They'll Know We Are Christians By Our Love* – "We are one in the Spirit, we are One in the Lord, etc." - replaced the splendor of *Thou, who at thy Eucharist Didst Pray*:

O thou, who at thy Eucharist didst pray that all thy church might be forever one, grant us at every Eucharist to say with longing heart and soul, 'Thy will be done': O may we all one bread, one body be, through this blest sacrament of unity.

The Eucharist is the "blest sacrament of unity." Because unity was central to the mission of Jesus, it is central to the mission of the Church. Is logic never tried?

The Apostles brought Jesus' great prayer: "Father, may they all be one". Unity formed the community of believers. Unity and peace, the fullness of life not the absence of conflict, it was central to their culture. It remains ours today.

Christians are identified by the way we live our faith. As people who await the "blessed hope and coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ" our mission is to be the presence of the Risen Lord wherever we are. We are to "Go and glorify the Lord by the way we live your life."

Use the Easter season to become more familiar with what it means to be a Catholic Christian and how to live your faith. Give expression to the experience you have in a relationship with Jesus. Let your co-workers and neighbors know that you believe Jesus Christ is Lord.

If being a Christian were a criminal activity is there any evidence you are violating the law? How does your faith "give witness to the resurrection"? What do you do to promote a Catholic culture by the way you express your faith? Nifty questions!

I encourage you to mark your calendars and attend Faith Sundays – July 21 with Bishop Tim Freyer, July 28 and August 4 with Fr. Monty Williams, SJ. Sunday evening Mass at 5:00pm followed by supper and a talk. It's part of the PSA rebate.

like to include, in this Novena, the name of your mother (living or deceased), grandmother, aunt, friend etc., novena envelopes are available in the Vestibule (entrance) of the church.



#### SECOND COLLECTION INFO



#### KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS—ESSAY CONTEST

Each year, the Knights of Columbus sponsor a California state essay contest in our school.

The goal of this **Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest** is to give students an opportunity to define the role of a Catholic citizen in many different scenarios, and to strengthen the bond between the Knights of Columbus and the school.

We conclude this series as we feature the essay contest winner, Faith A. who is in the 8th grade at St. Juliana School.

#### Faith writes:

"Faith is taking the first step even when you don't see the whole staircase." - Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. This means that when we place our trust in God, we know that he will lead us in the right direction, even when we don't know where we are going. There are so many ways for my family to show that we love and devote ourselves to God. We perform several different acts of kindness everyday, such as lending a hand or simply just putting on a smile. Like all families, we have different values and beliefs that we stay true to. Keeping these values and beliefs is an essential part to putting our faith in action, which is something that Jesus has taught us to do. My family puts our faith in action by believing in God, loving others and being kind.

First, one of the values we have is believing in God. An activity that we do as a family is reciting prayers everyday, such as saying grace before a meal or joining in on the prayers being spoken during Mass. Taking the time to sit down and pray can be hard sometimes, but we always try to find a place where we can just be alone and talk to God in silence. Another part of our belief is going to church every Sunday as a family, especially since it is one of the ten commandments, we try to follow it as best as possible. As we listen to the liturgy and the readings, we understand and reflect on what was being said after it is done being read aloud. Meanwhile, we also participate in the responses, such as the ones usually spoken during the prayer of the faithful.

Next, a second value we have is the belief that loving others is the same as loving God. In order to do this, we have to make some sacrifices, just as Jesus has done for us. One example of a sacrifice we make is during Lent, when we all give up something to show our respect for Jesus. Another part of this belief is that we try to be thoughtful towards everyone no matter what. Every single action is beneficial, no matter how small or how big it is. There are many reasons to show why we should be thoughtful, but one that stands out is the fact that we may never know what someone is going through or how they are feeling at that moment.

A final value that my family has is the belief that we should always be kind. Being kind to everyone, especially the more unfortunate ones, is something that Jesus has taught us to do. My family cares for the poor every year by making bags filled with food, water and other essentials that we give out to them during Christmas season. It is always good to offer a helping hand to those in need, because every good deed that we perform is a sign of our love towards that person and God's love towards us.

There are several ways that my family keeps our faith in action, such as believing in God, loving others and being kind. All of these beliefs are special to us because it shows people what kind of legacy we represent as a Catholic family. My family and I will continue to respect and keep our values, letting Jesus lead the way even if we don't know where we will end up.


