


THE PARISH AS ONE BODY

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M

What a fascinating two weeks of Sunday Gospel lessons! Last Sunday, July 21 and this Sunday, July 28 – Listen to the Word of God, the Word who is Jesus himself. Don't get distracted from the Good News. Pray as Jesus instructs. Act on the prayer. Take time to do it, each of us needs to. Summer retreat days.

There is nothing wrong with the "old" definition of prayer: "Prayer is the lifting up of our minds and hearts to God." That was question #475 in the Baltimore Catechism. Pause for a moment, #475! Prayer came quite late in our "Catholic formation" – didn't it? The lesson on the Our Father began with question #490! Pause for a moment. The "Our Father" was question #490. Folks, I understand the principle: "plow before you plant" – there was a lot of plowing, four hundred and ninety-seven questions and answers before we

learned to pray. Which begs the question: "Did the teacher get to question #475?"

Well, hold on! Today in Luke's Gospel chapter eleven, Jesus teaches the disciples pray the "perfect prayer," the Our Father because THEY ask him to be taught how to pray. In Matthew's Gospel, the Our Father is part of the Sermon on the Mount, chapter six.

Last week, in the Martha and Mary Gospel lesson, Jesus taught only one thing that matters. Each day like Martha we become "anxious and upset about many things" and we forget the one thing that is required, "lifting our minds and hearts to God."

Today, Sunday July 28th and next Sunday, August 4th our parish hosts a special guest. Fr. Monty Williams SJ (not Monty Williams the basketball coach) will lead us in a spiritual journey in the style of St. Ignatius of Loyola. Fr. Monty is a Jesuit. It's a time for each of us to retreat from what is making us anxious and upset and turn our attention to God and His plan for us and our parish.

We need not go away for a retreat. What is necessary is that we come together. Not some in the living room (Mary) and others in the kitchen (Martha) but together to listen to the Word of God (Jesus) and discern his will for us. This Sunday and next, come together in our church and parish center.

I have known Monty for many years. I know his presence in his writings especially *Stepping into Mystery* and another gem *The Gift of Spiritual Intimacy*. He has also written two volumes of *Finding God in the Dark* which takes readers through some movies and their theological themes.

Fr. Monty is a professor, a retreat director, spiritual director, and mischief maker. All great theologians have over-active imaginations, he certainly does. Some might ask: "What does a Jesuit know about Catholic Christianity – or any Christianity for that matter?" That is your invitation to come and find out!

Monty will celebrate and preach the 5:00PM Masses this Sunday and next. Together we will gather in the parish center for a meal and a talk with a discussion. You need not come to the Mass to come to the dinner and talk. These gatherings of Faith, Family, and Food are for you and your family. They are your PSA rebate. Come, bring your family, friends, and enemies.

ASKING FOR HELP

The Beatitudes praise the poor in spirit. One characteristic of those who are poor in spirit is their ability to ask for help; they know when others can provide what they lack. Today's readings encourage us to practice poverty in spirit by asking God for what we need. What could be more natural than to ask God for good things? God is, after all, the inventor of goodness and the giver of all good things.

Asking God for help puts us in conversation with God. These conversations take many forms. The reading from Genesis shows Abraham bantering with God like a skilled negotiator, while Saint Paul's letter to the Colossians praises God for answering us even when we don't deserve it. In Saint Luke's Gospel, Jesus not only gives us words to use in our conversations with God (the Our Father), but also promises that God always listens to our prayers. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.



The pilgrim experience of going by foot to Santiago de Compostella, the shrine of St. James, reached its high point this week at the feast of the Apostle, with tens of thousands of pilgrims on the road. Typically, they cover twelve to twenty miles a day through rough territory. The difficult journey and the often primitive lodging facilities are made bearable by the joy of the pilgrims, their songs and prayers. When their journey is documented properly, they receive the scallop shell, a reminder not only of James the fisherman, but also his call to fish for human beings and to baptize the nations. In the Middle Ages, those who wore this badge on their hats were granted lodging and hospitality wherever they went. Next to the palm, the sign of a Jerusalem pilgrim, the scallop shell was most highly prized.

In the Middle Ages, some people so enjoyed the pilgrim road, although it was filled with discomfort and danger, that they spent most of their lives on the road. Today, some people take up the route for exercise, but are drawn gradually into the spirituality of the journey. As you make your summer travels, always fold in an element of pilgrimage: a long walk through beautiful countryside, a visit to a church, a prayer of gratitude for your journey through life's hills and valleys.
