A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M



It's best to have a cautious spiritual understanding of the Scriptures rather than a literal one. Consider today's gospel lesson. Do you really believe Jesus is instructing his followers to hate their mothers and fathers?

Reasoning is what sets us human beings apart from the rest of creation. So, let reason take the lead. Some expressions are only verbally true, never literally truth. "Over achieve" is an example. While laziness or lack of motivation make under achieving possible, nobody literally over achieves. Reasonably, a person can only achieve the fullness of his/her potential or not. Saying that one is an over achiever might be another way of saying: "Honey, I didn't know you had it in you!" Which is never a compliment!

The gospels' greatest enemies are simple minds--reductionist minds, which fasten unshakably onto a single sentence and resolutely deny pertinent evidence to the contrary

If we take today's gospel in isolation from everything else Jesus said and did, there'd be precious few Christians left. To literalists, the only true Christians would be unnatural, inhuman, because they read Jesus saying we must literally hate our parents--when the fourth commandment and reason explicitly compels us to honor them.

Simple-minded literalists have no tolerance for symbolic language: expressing the truth by coming at it from an oblique angle, distorting it in carnival mirrors, in the hope of getting their attention.

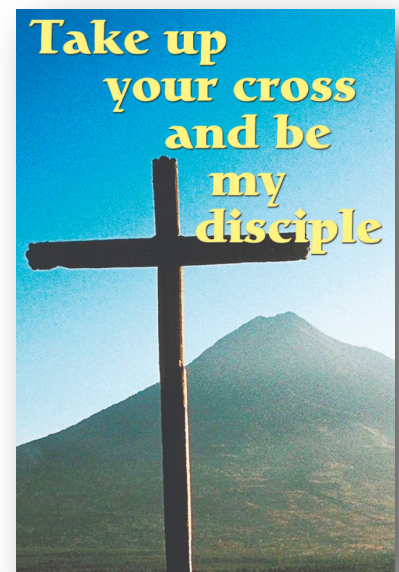
This is called "hyperbole," deliberate exaggeration to make a point. We use it all the time: "I'm starved! I could kill you for that!" Those statements don't mean, "I'm about to expire and say your prayers because you are about to die." But they do mean, "I'm a lot hungrier than usual and I'm a lot angrier at you than usual".

When Jesus says we should hate our parents, carry a cross, give up our possessions, he's setting off a firecracker to get our attention. He could have said, "If your brother were selling heroin, would you protect him, or his victims? Which is more important to you: your family or being honest?" Same message, different means.

Jesus was using hyperbole when he said, "It's as difficult for a rich man to get into heaven as for a camel to get through the eye of a needle." He wasn't saying it was impossible for the rich to enter heaven; just be sure you haven't forgotten or replaced God with your love for money and possessions.

That story of the man building the tower makes sense. Being Christian isn't a matter of impulse or feeling--any more than genuine love is an impulse or feeling; both demand careful consideration. Neither being Christian nor loving is a blind leap; it's a *reasoned* commitment--that takes over when the call to be Christian and the beloved are no longer very enjoyable. But, before you say you're truly Christian, before you say you truly love someone--think about the tough times ahead. The "cross times."

Jesus asks us to take up the cross of living in the world, and face it every day in the same way he did – with dignity and God's strength. To be his disciple means to imitate him, honor your families, enjoy your friends but focus on the Greatest Good and bring that Great Good, God - with dignity and courage, to everyone you meet. Do it especially when you are tempted to do otherwise.

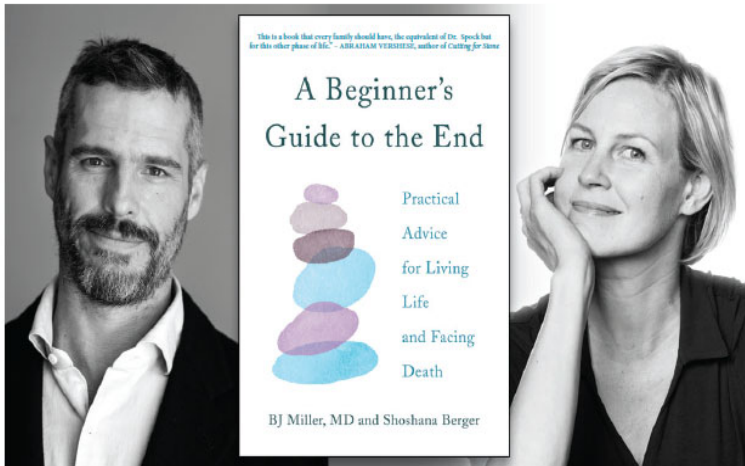

Dying is a universal human experience, yet it is a subject we often avoid until standing in the face of it. How do we cope with the inevitability of death? How can we make better decisions for ourselves and our families? UCSF palliative care physician BJ Miller and IDEO's Shoshana Berger answer the questions about end of life we're all afraid to ask with their new book, *A Beginner's Guide to the End: Practical Advice for Living Life and Facing Death*. BJ Miller, MD, is an assistant clinical professor of medicine at the University of California, San Francisco where he practices and teaches palliative medicine. She has written for The New York Times, Wired, Popular Science, SPIN, and Marie Claire. She is the author of ReadyMade: How to Make [Almost] Everything: A Do-It-Yourself Primer.
