Greetings, my name is James R. Abowd and recently I began serving St. Juliana Falconieri parish community as the Director of Pastoral Ministry. I welcome the opportunity to be part of a community whose vision is to “live as a people of God with Christ at the center of our lives through liturgy, faith formation and community.”

My life growing up is best described by this scripture: “For as in one body we have many parts, and all the parts do not have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ and individually parts of one another. [Romans 12:4-5]

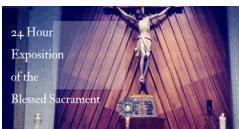



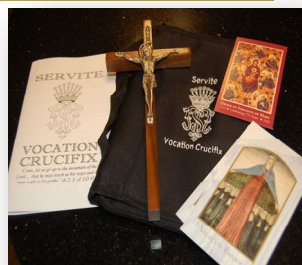
