A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M

I believe in God. Let's talk about what kind of God and what your actions mean.

"What you do speaks so loudly, I can't hear what you are saying." Is this true of your faith and the way you act, the decisions you make? Are you an ambassador of God and His Son Jesus where you live, work, are educated, and spend your time. How do you put faith into action?

Formal education trains our minds to think, very often all the bits of information we learn might be treated as if it is all equal. "I before E except after C and when there is a long A sound as in weigh and neighbor." "In the beginning, God ..." "In 1492 Columbus sailed the ocean blue." "Do this, in memory of me." "PV=nRT" "Jesus died and rose from the dead." "To be or not to be." "I will be your God and you shall be my people." "Amo, Amas, Amat". "How well did Isaiah prophesy about you hypocrites."

Is the purpose of education to get a good job and make a lot of money? If education's purpose is utilitarian - it's usefulness - you should have found out by now, much of the information you learned is not used after you passed the test. And, what you thought would be useless is useful.

Finally, there are somethings that were never taught, like sleep deprivation and child raising.

"I believe in God, the Father Almighty. I believe in Jesus His only begotten Son. I believe in the Holy Spirit." How often do you put that knowledge to use?

Here's the issue: belief is knowledge put to use. Belief is knowledge put to action. If you hear the weather person predict rain, you will carry your umbrella. Using the knowledge, you fetched your umbrella. We learned the general gas law and Latin declensions; yet having passed the tests much of that knowledge is useless today. "I had calculus, as I had a winter cold, and I am fully recovered from it."

Formal schooling must be reinforced in the home. A relationship between the material to be learned and the learner is essential. Encourage learning at home. Once interest in the material grows, the student enjoys learning it. Terminal senioritis destroys learning.

Here's the second issue: Catholic education's principle is "the love of learning and the desire for God." Perhaps as youngsters we learned some piosity about God but we went no farther in our study or even relationship with God. Today, God knowledge and God's friendship remain vague and in a box marked "arrested development". Adult theology and a developed spiritual life remain stuck somewhere between childhood and adolescence. Does this profile fit: "I am embarrassed to speak about God, Jesus, or the Catholic Church to my friends, co-workers, or anyone. I talk about pizza toppings, sports, or Costco products. God is under the radar."

We say, "We believe in God." We carry umbrellas when the weather person predicts rain. What actions follow: "We believe in God?" A nifty question.

I encourage you, high school and older, to participate in our Monday faith formation class on the liturgy.

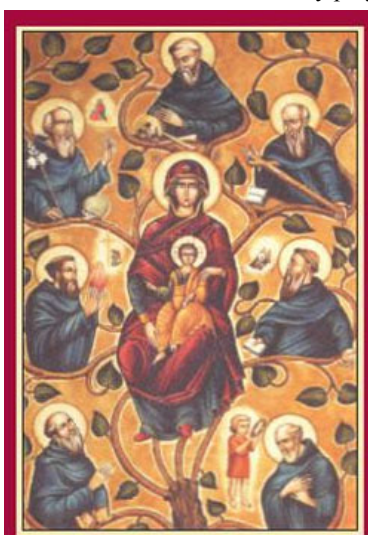
Order of Friar Servants of Saint Mary

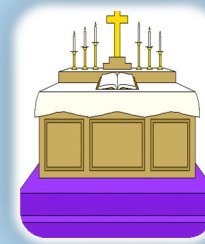

The Lenten season begins on Ash Wednesday, February 26, 2020 and ends with the beginning of the Easter Triduum and the celebration of the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 9, 2020.

In a particular way during Lent, we are asked to devote ourselves to the spiritual and corporal works of mercy that "remind us that faith finds expression in concrete everyday actions meant to help our neighbors in body and spirit."

The following practices are to be observed by Catholics in the Diocese of Orange in their penitential practices:.

Fasting and Abstinence

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, a priest should be consulted.

Ash Wednesday, Feb. 26, 2020 and Good Friday, Apr. 10, 2020 are days of *fast and abstinence*.
All the Fridays of Lent are days of *abstinence*.

Prayer, Fasting, Almsgiving

are the three traditional disciplines of Lent.

The faithful should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and renewal of baptism at Easter.

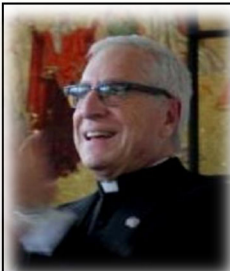

The Stations of the Cross are a 14-step Catholic devotion that commemorates Jesus Christ's last day on Earth as a man.

The 14 devotions, or stations, focus on specific events of His last day, beginning with His condemnation.

The stations are commonly used as a mini pilgrimage as the individual moves from station to station.

At each station, the individual recalls and meditates on a specific event from Christ's last day. Specific prayers are recited, then the individual moves to the next station until all 14 are complete.

Everyone is encouraged to attend.
