### A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M

While reflecting on his long life in the Church, an elder priest used to tell me: “Mike, It left me, I didn’t leave it.”

Most of the time I thought he was being nostalgic. Or melancholic. Or cynical.

Indeed, along with the priest or a person dealing with change, the melancholic mood of the Beatles’ song “In My Life” comes to mind: “There are places I’ll remember all my life, though some have changed. Some forever, not for better ...” Life in the church today can leave us feeling orphaned, even spiritually orphaned. Regarding the Catholic Church, some faithful believe that its culture is disappearing fast. The choices seem to be either embrace new normal or reject what is replacing the old and familiar. Is the new liberating or hopelessly screwed up? What happened to what we knew as “Catholic culture”?

Begin with the God of our belief.

On April 8, 1966, Time Magazine ran a famous cover “GOD IS DEAD”. Theologians, sociologists, philosophers, and psychologists, Karl Marx (1818-1883), Fredrick Nietzsche (1844-1900), and Sigmund Freud (1856-1939) were all writing about it. Students were reading and believing this most profound obituary. I recall reading graffiti in the lavatory: “God is dead” Nietzsche. And the response: “Nietzsche is Dead. God”

In time, a fine literature professor taught the play: “A Raisin in the Sun” by Lorraine Hansberry. Written in 1958 and set in the Southside of Chicago, here is a gem of its dialogue:

**Mama** (*Kindly*): ‘Course you going to be a doctor, honey, God willing.

**Beneatha** (*Drily*): God hasn’t got a thing to do with it.

**Mama**: Beneatha — that just wasn’t necessary.

**Beneatha**: Well — neither is God. I get sick of hearing about God.

**Mama**: Beneatha!

**Beneatha**: I mean it! I’m just tired of hearing about God all the time. What has He got to do with anything? Does He pay tuition?

**Mama**: You ’bout to get your fresh little jaw slapped!

**Ruth**: That’s just what she needs, all right!

**Beneatha**: Why? Why can’t I say what I want to around here, like everybody else?

**Mama**: It don’t sound nice for a young girl to say things like that — you wasn’t brought up that way. Me and your father went to trouble to get you and Brother to church every Sunday.

**Beneatha**: Mama, you don’t understand. It’s all a matter of ideas, and God is just one idea I don’t accept. It’s not important. I am not going out and be immoral or commit crimes because I don’t believe in God. I don’t even think about it. It’s just that I get tired of Him getting credit for all the things the human race achieves through its own stubborn effort. There simply is no blasted God — there is only man and it is *he* who makes miracles!

*(MAMA absorbs this speech, studies her daughter and rises slowly and crosses to BENEATHA and slaps her powerfully across the face. After, there is only silence and the daughter drops her eyes from her mother’s face, and MAMA is very tall before her)*

**Mama**: Now — you say after me, in my mother’s house there is still God.

*(There is a long pause and BENEATHA stares at the floor wordlessly. MAMA repeats the phrase with precision and cool emotion)* In my mother’s house there is still God.

**Beneatha**: In my mother’s house there is still God.’ *(A long pause)*

Right on, Mama! My Mama too! There was God in our family which led to Church on Sunday, even Mass on days we were not obligated to attend, devotions during Lent, no-meat and restricted fun on Fridays of Lent - although it was no hardship, I liked the options, pasta every Sunday.

Folks, we fight an up-hill battle with secular culture. As we look forward to Lent, renew belief in God and its practice in our parish Catholic culture. Aren’t we really facing an unaddressed faith crisis?

You are the light of the world, shine your light! Does belief in God show in the way you live your life? In the way you keep the Sabbath different from the rest of the secular week? Is Sunday, not just a fun day, but the Lord’s Day in your family? Is your Catholicism a secret to your non-Catholic neighbors? Do they know you are Catholic and belong to St. Juliana Falconieri Parish?

“Mike, It left me. I didn’t leave it.” Do we even notice it is gone?

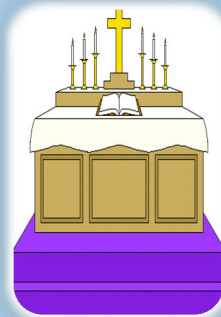



**STATIONS OF THE CROSS** 6:30pm on Fridays during Lent in the church

The Stations of the Cross are a 14-step Catholic devotion that commemorates Jesus Christ's last day on Earth as a man. The 14 devotions, or stations, focus on specific events of His last day, beginning with His condemnation. The stations are commonly used as a mini pilgrimage as the individual moves from station to station. At each station, the individual recalls and meditates on a specific event from Christ's last day. Specific prayers are recited, then the individual moves to the next station until all 14 are complete. **Everyone is encouraged to attend.**

The World Day of the Sick, February 11<sup>th</sup>, instituted in 1992 by St. John Paul II is celebrated every year on the commemoration of Our Lady of Lourdes, for all believers who seek "a special time of prayer and sharing, of offering one's suffering". St John Paul II wrote a great deal on the topic of suffering (especially once he was diagnosed with Parkinson's Disease) and believed that suffering was very much a salvific and a redeeming process through Christ.

In 2018, Pope Francis wrote: "The memory of this long history of service to the sick is cause for rejoicing on the part of Christian community, and especially those presently engaged in this ministry. Yes, we must look to the past above all to let it enrich us. We should learn the lesson it teaches us about the self-sacrificing generosity of many founders of institutes in the service of the infirm, the creativity, prompted by charity, of many initiatives undertaken over the centuries, and the commitment to scientific research as a means of offering innovative and reliable treatments to the sick. This legacy of the past helps us to build a better future, for example, by shielding Catholic hospitals from the business mentality that is seeking worldwide to turn health care into a profit-making enterprise, which ends up discarding the poor." **Let us take special care to remember the sick, the infirmed and their caregivers this week.**

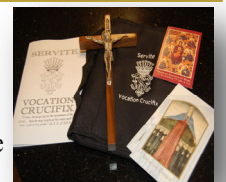
