




THE PARISH AS ONE BODY

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M

Without linking the sin and the sinner, good Catholics confess in these or similar words: "I misused God's holy name." Sometimes I ask, "When did you use it properly?" "I don't know what you mean, father." A discussion begins: "Well, did you recognize an opportunity to evangelize someone or to tell someone who uses the Divine Name as an expletive that you find it offensive? Apart from saying, 'God bless you' when someone sneezes when or how do you use God's name?" Silence.


Of course silence. Do we know how to speak about God publically outside of church?

I've done minimal Google research to find that "In God We Trust" was accepted as our nation's motto, we stamp it on our coins, we proclaim that our nation is "Under God" when we recite the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. I believe a strophe of the *Battle Hymn of the Republic* – perhaps our nation's best poem/song is loaded with theistic and Christian overtones:

"In the beauty of the lilies Christ was born across the sea

With a glory in His bosom that transfigures you and me:

As He died to make men holy, let us live to make men free While God is marching on."



Pretty awesome, don't you agree? Is it still taught? Can it be? Is it believed? Can it be?

To my delight, I have noticed many courageous young men and women associated with FOCUS and other movements who are proudly Catholic wear crosses outside their shirts. Their outer garments are silkscreened with messages of Catholic Christianity. They speak of theism and Christianity in a full-throttled and confident manner. Not being hypocrites, they act as loving Christians. They "Glorify God by the way they live their lives." Awesome, don't you agree?

I absolve those who misuse the name of God. I encourage those who are hesitant to speak out.

Back to the original question: "Why wouldn't a believer speak of God openly, outside of the walls of the church?" Lack of faith? Embarrassment? Not a strong relationship with God? Religion is too private? Stop me when I'm close.

Rise up! Believe in God! Form a relationship with Him. Don't be hesitant to speak about God.



Now for something completely different: "Woo Hoo! Fantastic! This is terrific. Build that wall! Well, that's a hit out of the park!" These are the remarks that came back to me after I sent the Parish Finance Council a brief letter I received from the Diocese of Orange: "Dear Fr. Michael,

It is our pleasure to inform you that your School has been awarded the following *Parishes In Collaboration* grant for \$50,000, which is to be used towards the School Perimeter Fencing project."

It's pretty difficult to contain myself, even during Lent. Together with parents of our grammar school, Mr. Gonzales recognized the need for a safety perimeter fence around our school. The design and cost were researched. It became the "Fund A Need" at the Gala. The school community, Mr. Gonzales, and I are most grateful to **CLIF** for matching the funds raised that night. Now with the additional generous grant from the Diocese, the project will not be a financial burden. When you see Bishop Vann, or any of the three bishops, please thank them. Recall it was a \$200,000 gift that began the enhancements to our church building. That's \$250,000 of pure gift. These grants come from the annual collection taken at all parishes. For all good gifts – Thanks be to God.

ST. JOSPEPH'S DAY - MAR. 19

Joseph, someone once joked, was indeed the perfect husband: the only major character in Jesus' story who never utters a word! But the Gospel recounts and the liturgy celebrates his silent witness of faith-filled deeds: "With a husband's love he cherished Mary, the Virgin Mother of God; with fatherly care he watched over Jesus" (Preface of Saint Joseph, Sacramentary). Catholic devotion, therefore, hails him as patronprotector of the universal Church. Some cultures set a festive "Saint Joseph's Table," welcoming the poor and strangers to feast with family and friends. Tradition keeps today as the anniversary of his death, which we presume was peaceful, with Jesus and Mary present. Thus, Catholics invoke Joseph as Patron of a Happy Death. Descended from David's house, which God finished "building" through Joseph's provision of a home for Mary and Jesus, he was, fittingly, a carpenter by trade; thus, patron of workers. Spring, nature's rebirth, begins between his feast and Annunciation (March 25), appropriately, since Joseph's silent obedience and Mary's "Let it be done to me according to your word" (Luke 1:38) usher in humanity's spiritual rebirth.

The list of times for individual confessions are also included, as many parishes add extra time during Lent.
