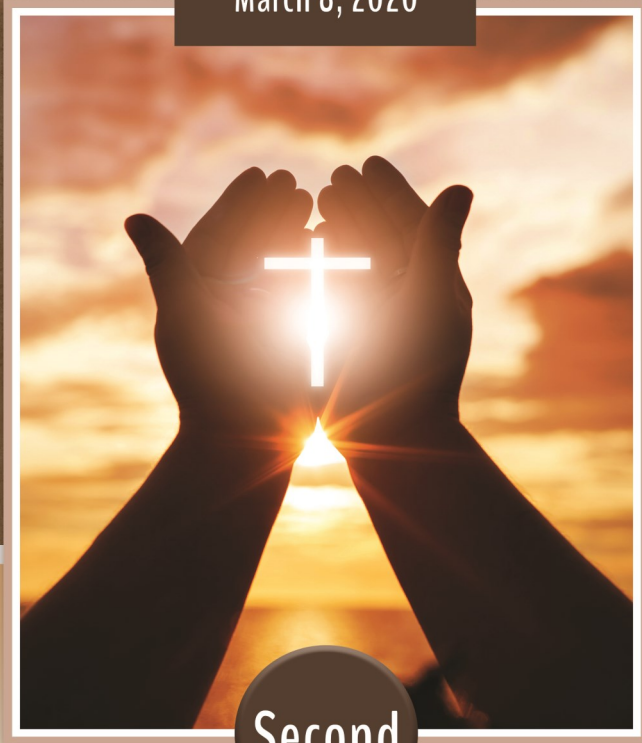

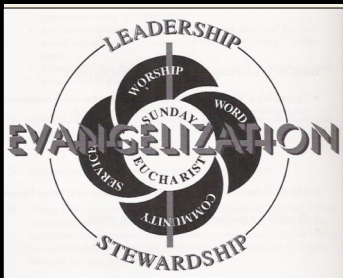

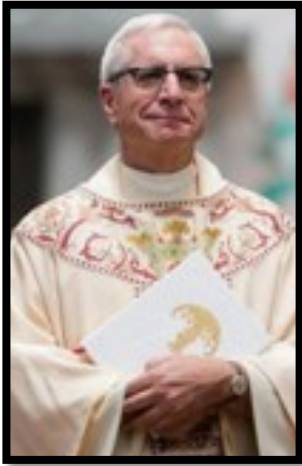

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M

The God course continued.

Is God distant, out of sight and usually out of mind? When God is, He is some philosophical, strangely not a theological, abstraction of academic words memorized long ago? Truths recited in the creed. Barely in your understanding and not in your circle of friendship? During those school years, math skills increased beyond need. Science was interesting, still without much use in life. Religion, the empty set.

Perhaps God is anonymous. Just as anonymous as the farmer who grew the avocado that is used to make guacamole. How do people experience God? William Harvey found that blood circulates in the human body or Alexander Fleming found the miracle drug penicillin by searching. By wanting to know. Do you want to find God? Respond to the One who is calling you to “Come and See”.

Scientists trust their suspicions. Their subject draws them in. They run tests, collect data, arrange the data, and form a conclusion. Finally, they put their conclusion out to be critiqued by other experts.

Until you feel drawn to find God, He will remain as unknown as that mold called penicillin, the movement of blood, or the avocado on the tree. He'll be as far from your life as is Clem Kiddlehopper.

Suppose you want to have a relationship with God, where would you start? Let's rule out the catechism which taught those academic words. Psst: Begin with the same way of initiating a friendship with anyone. Notice His existence. Get a feeling of joy from Him. Be intrigued by Him. I suggest you explore our treasury of fine liturgical songs or works of visual art. I suggest listening to other people's stories of finding God. Read the lives of saints to experience especially their joy.

Notice the deeper the relationship with God, the deeper the trust that God is real. The deeper William Harvey or Alexander Fleming dug into their studies and related to the data, the more they trusted their discovery. Crazy as it sounds; they had a real relationship with data. Recapture the joy of the moment of a scientific discovery. The joy of John Glenn's space flight. In a most sublime way, relive the joy of that Kirk Gibson homerun.

Following an encounter with God, Moses, Mary, Peter, Paul, and every saint found joy, even “radiant joy”. The joy of an encounter with God is not philosophically abstract words. It's the heart of a relationship that directs lives toward union with God. How do you celebrate the joy of God in your life?

What about doubt? Scientists have doubt; I bet John Glenn had palpable doubt when he blasted into space. Who would not have doubted Tommy Lasorda's judgement on game one of the 1988 World Series, played at Dodger Stadium? Injured Dodger player Kirk Gibson comes to bat; a pinch hitter, bottom of the ninth inning, two outs, and Mike Davis on base, Dodgers behind 4-3. With 2-2 count, BOOM! Walk off home run! Dodgers win! “Walk off” is a phrase coined by losing pitcher Dennis Eckersley. “The impossible can happen” – said St. Vince Scully. I doubt that doubt is sinful. Quite often, I am sure that people who act on unchecked certitudes commit sin.

Discuss this among yourselves tonight! Or all week.



Following a recent directive of Bishop Vann and already the practice of many pastors, we at St. Juliana will distribute Holy Communion only under the one species of bread. Sensitive to parishioners, in the midst of the Coronavirus, this is a precautionary measure. Bishop has also asked that we not hold hands during the Our Father or the Greeting of Peace.

I ask your prudential judgment in this matter.

Lent is all about change and change is usually not easy. In order to change we have to leave something behind. Today we hear about a very old man who decides to answer God's call. Abram experiences a tremendous amount of change when he leaves everything behind, risking it all for God's promise. Jesus changes, is transfigured, right before the eyes of his disciples. The Lenten scriptures issue the call for us to change, to be transfigured, so that we, too, will soon share in the glory of God. What is it that the Lord is asking us to leave behind? Are we willing to take the risk for the promise made by God? These questions are at the heart of the Lenten journey of conversion.

**DIOCESAN NEWS -

For the year 2020, Bishop Vann has agreed to a different approach for "24 Hours for the Lord." As you may recall, "24 Hours for the Lord" is Pope Francis' initiative to share more widely the mercy of God through the Sacrament of Penance and Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament for a 24 hour period between the **3rd** and **4th Sundays of Lent**. This year in lieu of the event at Christ Cathedral, (in addition to the Penance Services listed above) the Diocese is publishing the dates for **all** the Penance Services with individual confessions celebrated throughout the Diocese of Orange during Lent. The list of times for individual confessions are also included, as many parishes add extra time during Lent.

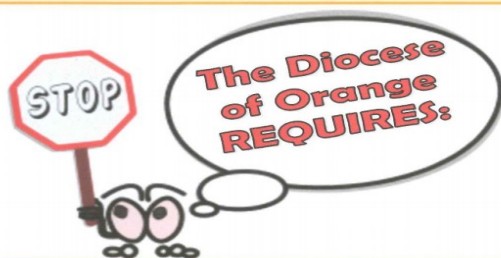

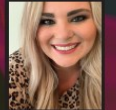
