
VISION & MISSION STATEMENTS

THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, February 12 Always by Our Side

Lent gives us the opportunity to deepen our relationship with God. James teaches us what unwavering faith can accomplish, while the Pharisees demonstrate how people of little or no faith live. James shows us how faith can overcome challenges that many of us know wholeheartedly and firsthand. We may know people who have no relationship with God. These people need assurance, "a sign" to believe. Let us be that sign. *Today's readings: James 1:1–11; Psalm 119:67, 71, 72, 75, 76; Mark 8:11–13.*

Tuesday, February 13 A Spiritual Journey

Have you ever been on a family trip when one member's sudden exclamation of "I forgot to pack!" is followed by another's reassuring response, "Don't stress, we'll figure something out"? Something similar can happen along our faith journey. In this scenario, God is that voice telling us not to worry, that he will help us prevail. God will give us the fortitude for a spiritual Lenten journey. Today's readings: James 1:12–18; Psalm 94:12–13a, 14–15, 18–19; Mark 8:14–21.

Wednesday, February 14 Symbol of Life

Today the ashes on our foreheads announce to the world that we acknowledge our sin and have faith in the saving cross of Christ. Despite the visibility of the ashes, they are meant to be a sign of conversion rather than an emblem of pride. Matthew encourages us to go about our lives without flaunting our good deeds. It is enough that we know what we have done for the love of neighbor. Today's readings: Joel 2:12–18; Psalm 51:3–4, 5–6ab, 12–13, 14 and 17; 2 Corinthians 5:20–6:2; Matthew 6:1–6, 16–18.

Thursday, February 15 Perfect Role Model

Who are your role models? As children, we may name a professional athlete or our parents. As we age and our faith grows along with us, we may begin to be inspired by saints. Today's Gospel reminds us of our greatest role model, Jesus Christ. Jesus gives us the template for a holy life. He also warns us that his path is not easy and that we must help one another along the journey. Our goal is to continue Jesus' mission. Today's readings: Deuteronomy 30:15–20; Psalm 1:1–2; 3, 4, 6; Luke 9:22–25.

Friday, February 16 Caring for Others

Look within and discern whether your external actions reflect your internal thoughts. Do you see a relationship between the way you observe the rules of fasting and abstinence and the way you treat others? Is God pleased that a Church law has been observed when you have been unkind to someone you find annoying? When experiencing a problem with another, ask God to fill you with love toward your neighbor. Strive to live a holy life not for recognition by others but for your love for God. *Today's readings: Isaiah 58:1–9a; Psalm 51:3–4, 5–6a, 18–19; Matthew 9:14–15.*

Saturday, February 17 Saying Yes

Many of us have heard the saying "God doesn't call the qualified, he qualifies the called." In today's Gospel, Jesus called Levi, and Levi followed without hesitation. The other apostles followed the same pattern. Each of them left everything behind to join Jesus' ministry. How can you act as a missionary disciple, inspiring others to do what is needed to follow Jesus? *Today's readings: Isaiah 58:9b–14; Psalm 86:1–2, 3–4, 5–6: Luke 5:27–32.*



Diocese of Orange 2024 Lenten Regulations

The upcoming Lenten season, commencing on Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2024, and concluding with the commencement of the Easter Triduum and the observance of the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, March 28, 2024, invites us to engage in a period of spiritual reflection and preparation for the joyous celebration of Easter. Lent provides a valuable occasion for us to ready ourselves for the Easter festivities, to accompany catechumens as they prepare for the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, and for the already baptized to renew our commitment through acts of penance, prayer, and charitable giving. During Lent. there is a special emphasis on dedicating ourselves to both spiritual and corporal works of mercy. These actions serve as tangible expressions of our faith, demonstrating our commitment to assisting our neighbors in both physical and spiritual dimensions.

Below, please see the guidelines outlining the practices that Catholics in the Diocese of Orange are called to observe during this sacred season of Lent.

FASTING


- In the dioceses in the United States, Catholics aged 18 through 59 are bound to fast on both Ash Wednesday (February 14, 2024) and Good Friday (March 29, 2024).
- To fast means a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Food and drink between meals (excepting water and medicine) is not permitted on fast days.

ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT

- Catholics aged 14 and up are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.
- ♦ To abstain means refraining from eating beef, veal, pork, or poultry at least, although eggs and milk products are acceptable. The consumption of fish and shellfish is permitted, though the penitential character of the abstinence should be kept in mind.

EASTER DUTY

♦ All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year. This precept is to be fulfilled during the Easter Season unless it is fulfilled, for a just cause, at some other time during the year.
