


VISION & MISSION STATEMENTS



Every year when I do this, I feel like a better person each time. Every year. When we're done with the present, before we carry them all to the car, we take a photo next to the presents and we all have a great time helping others in need. As you can see, I can share my time, talents, and treasures with my family and my church community, and it makes me feel like a better person and boosts my idea to help people all around the world.
