


VISION & MISSION STATEMENTS



You might know this phenomenon from his work in "In the Heights". Or maybe if you're four years old you know him from Moana or Encanto. Either way you know him, you love him, he's in Alexander Hamilton, or I mean, Lin Manuel Miranda! When it comes to living a virtuous life in God by being loving, just, and hopeful, no one does it better than Lin Manuel Miranda.

We all know Miranda fought in the American Revolution and won our independence from Great Britain, but did you know that he is also a huge activist for Puerto Rico. Although Miranda came up being raised in Manhattan, his feelings for and cultural identity to the island of Puerto Rico are extremely profound in his artistic work and philanthropist activities. In September of 2017, the island fell into indescribable tragedy when hurricane Maria hit. As he witnessed the disaster unfold, Miranda felt a strong obligation to respond back to the place that significantly influenced his identity As a result he made "Like a Prayer" This extraordinary work brought together twenty Puerto Rican artists each one of them contributing their story transforming the project into an anthem of overcoming and hope All of the proceeds from the song's sales were directed towards relief efforts for those impacted by the hurricane. Through Miranda's unyielding loyalty to his Puerto Rican heritage, and to using his creative voice for social good, he unfolds the human spirit of empathy that commands itself during moments of crisis. By his musicality and activism, he motivates people to fight for justice and act on their behalf with the power that we can change the world when we come together.

Miranda grew up surrounded by show tunes, which filled his home with vibrant energy and artistic inspiration. This early exposure to musical theater played a crucial role in his life. Not only are the impacts of his personal successes outstanding, but he is one of the leading figures in the National Hispanic Media Coalition (NHMC), a group battling hate and racism in Latino communities. As a Latina in the arts, I can agree that I often feel marginalized because of my heritage. They will tell you; you simply don't have the look they seek, but truly the only look they seek is one of a stereotypically beautiful white woman. And yet the stage is the one place where I, and others like me feel truly free. Furthermore, his actions represent his basic beliefs, deeply rooted sense of Catholicism, and underscore his commitment to ending social injustice, enriching the arts as crucial elements of social transformation. Throughout his entire life Miranda has always been hopeful. He grew up in Manhattan,

And though he didn't let the harsh city discourage him from his dreams, he also wasn't blindsided either. He began writing songs from a very tender age, being explicit right from the start with what he wanted to accomplish. He prayed, and hoped, and trusted God carrying out the work knowing the Holy Spirit was always at his side. Miranda reports that through the process of writing Hamilton, he grew increasingly devout. As he immersed himself in the stories of America's founding fathers, he found himself reflecting on his own identity. The routine went beyond just music and lyrics, but to exploring his perspective of the world as a whole. Each character he penned, every note he composed, served as a testament to his resilience and determination to succeed. Every show and every reaction of the public demonstrated to him that his quest was not only his own, but for the silent dreamers in the world who are battling alongside him.

Whether you call him Alex or Miranda, his endearing acts of love, justice, and hope demonstrate his eternal vocation to the Lord. He has shown an abundance of love for the impoverished people. Not only that, but he evokes justice and hope in his every day actions serving as a spectacular role model for fellow followers of Christ. Needless to say, Lin Manuel Miranda is incredible. He shows his love and devotion for our Father in everything he does. He truly makes you think "What can I do to help other?" So, go! Live like Lin! With love, justice, hope, and a whole lot of style.
