


VISION & MISSION STATEMENTS


Live The Liturgy Inspiration of the Week

It is the top of the ninth inning, two outs. Mariano Rivera who is arguably the best closing pitcher of all time, is on the mound. The batter steps up to the plate, the pitch is thrown, and crack, the ball soars into shallow left field, and the ball is caught. The New York Yankees win the Nineteen Nighty Nine World Series. Though Mariano Is one of the best relief pitchers in recent Major League Baseball history, he is also very active in charity. Rivera is known to be a very compassionate person, especially towards those who are not as fortunate as, him. He was raised as a Catholic, and he brought these faithful ideologies into his adult life. The Hall of Fame relief pitcher, Mariano Rivera, encompasses the ability to learn from past failures, work with Catholic Charities, and contribute to the construction of community centers which are Catholic Christian ideals that I can replicate in my daily life.

First, Rivera's ability to learn from his failures is something that is an infinitely important thing that I can show in my daily life. Whenever Rivera does something wrong, he always looks back and with newly learned information finds the best way to make the situation better. One time, he gave up a homerun and felt ashamed. When I do fail though, I pick myself up and try to put it past me. For example, I was playing baseball, and I struck out, I stopped thinking about it then I got a hit in the next at bat. While learning from Rivera, I have understood that learning from failure is a very important trait to reenact in my daily life.

Next, Rivera works with Catholic Charities which is a doctrine that makes kids' dreams come true. Rivera has been donating his money to kids for just shy of twenty-seven years. Over the course of those endless years, he has generously donated greater than eight million dollars to underprivileged kids all over the United States and Panama. Also, he has created his own foundation, the "Mariano Rivera Foundation" which has donated nearly five million dollars as well. With a combined total of over thirteen million dollars donated. Rivera's donations have positively affected the lives of many Panamanians and Americans. My family and I donated money as well. We adore seeing the gleeful faces of those who are impoverished. We always donate food to St. Vincent de Paul organization and help pass it out. I also work with dog charity events. Due to the fact that Rivera and I are associated with Catholic Charities is something that is very important and rewarding for me.

Rivera has funded the construction of community centers which are very necessary especially because he lives in New York. Rivera has lived in New York for at least thirty years. The weather is consistently unpleasant to those living there. Every year from November to March there are blizzards all of the time. Commonly, Community Homes are free and they give people places to live. Community can be used as a trampoline to get yourself back on your feet. My family and I fund those community centers because they are non-profit organizations, and they need money to provide for its inhabitants. We donate so we can keep the dream on. Rivera's decision to contribute to the construction of the community centers are helpful to those who are harmed by the blizzards.

Lastly, the famous Mariano Rivera incorporates three virtuous doctrines that I can mirror they are the skills to reflect on disappointments, supply money to Catholic Charities, and permit the development of Community Centers. Looking back and recognizing past shortcomings are very important to becoming a better person and Rivera shows that perfectly. Funding the Catholic Charities brings countless smiles to those who are poor. Helping those build community Centers show that Rivera cares. Even though Rivera is known as a baseball player, his Catholic virtues show that Catholicism belongs to anyone.
